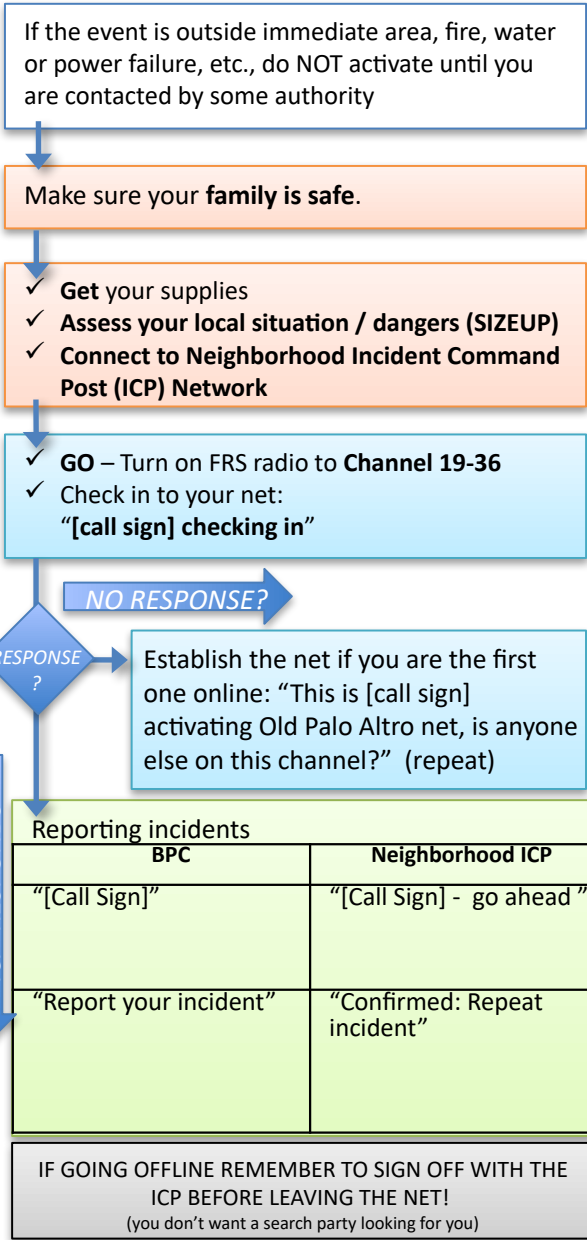

REPEAT	Repeat what you said
COPY	I understand
STAND BY	Stop speaking and wait
NEGATIVE	No
AFFIRMATIVE	Yes/go ahead
CLEAR	Everything is OK
CLEARED, ICP or NCP	Understood your status report
STATUS	Request for description of injury or physical damage
SAY AGAIN	Repeat
COME AGAIN	Repeat
CORRECTION	Error ... Right info follows
MORE TO FOLLOW	More information coming
OUT xx mins/hrs	If going offline for a while
SIGNING OUT	Out for the day
CHECKING IN	Checking in

- Critical Events (Threat to LIFE & SAFETY)**
1. Immediate medical incidents
 2. Burning fire threatening lives or neighboring prop.
 3. Hazards that are a threat to safety
 4. Structural Damage with trapped victims
- REPORT CRITICAL EVENTS IMMEDIATELY**

Hazards	
Category	Description
Fire	Burning ... threatening to spread?
Gas Leak	Smell gas?
Water Leak	Road Blocked?
Electrical	Downed power lines – Road blocked? Sparks ?
Chemical	Strange smell / unusual smoke Posted hazard symbol present

Structural Damage	
Category	Description
Light	Broken windows, fallen plaster, minor content damage
Moderate	Visible signs of damage but structure still on foundation Major content damage
Heavy	Partial or total collapse Structure not attached to foundation Tilting / Structural instability Fire / Gas leaks / other hazards

People (no names on radio)	
Category	Description
Trapped	Equipment Required
Minor	Cuts, bruises, sprains
Immediate	Life threatening, Shock, severe blood loss Breathing problems Describe injuries in comments sect.
Dead or Black	Only if obvious

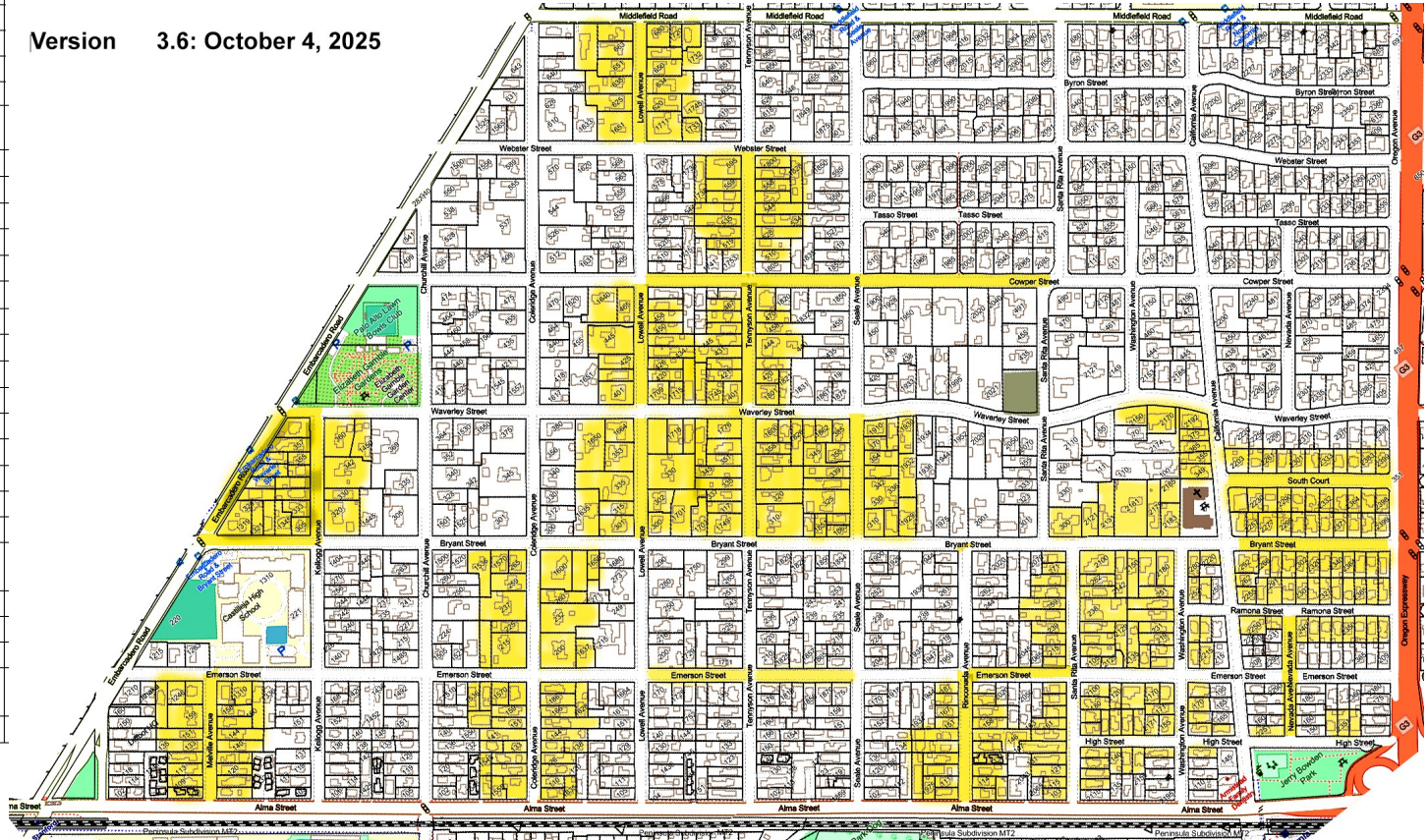
